



Since 2014, we have been working alongside activists, independent organizations, and victims of human rights violations in Cuba, strengthening their capacity for documentation, protection, and international advocacy in a context of repression and civic restrictions.

Key Findings

- **More than 500** people trained in documenting human rights violations.
- **16** independent organizations strengthened.
- **62** human rights defenders provided with technical support.
- **304** people represented before international protection mechanisms.

Documentation and Monitoring

We document and verify arbitrary detentions, harassment, immigration restrictions, and other violations of human rights.

Litigation and International Protection

We represent victims and organizations before the IACHR, United Nations Special Procedures, and treaty bodies.

International Impact

We participate in multilateral forums such as the United Nations, the Organization of American States, and the Inter-American System.

Communication and Visibility

We coordinate campaigns and communication initiatives to amplify the voices of independent civil society in Cuba.

Recent Achievements

- We participated in the **44th cycle of Cuba's Universal Periodic Review (2023)** and in the **89th session of the CEDAW Committee (2024)**.
- We submitted joint reports with independent Cuban organizations.
- We participated in thematic hearings before the **IACHR between 2023 and 2026**.
- We pursued international legal actions in high-profile cases involving human rights defenders, journalists, religious leaders, and victims of the July 11 attacks.
- We produced specialized publications on freedom of association and women political prisoners in Cuba.
